Linda Ware, OT, CHT



Staff development, student program, research (including grant funding), multidisciplinary teamwork, performance improvement, program development, technology development and challenging patient care are some of her rewarding responsibilities.

Ms. Ware had the amazing experience of working at the Curtis National Hand Center where she perfected her skills in hand therapy which was instrumental in her receiving her hand therapy certification. She continues her professional scholarship as a coauthor in the publication of *Hand and Upper Extremity Rehabilitation: A Practical Guide*, which has been released in the fourth edition.
